BUS TICKETS HOME

A week later, we saw her at a Pop-Up. She had walked out of the Koala program due to a bad experience. A few days later, Robin received a call: Marie was home with her mom. She had hitchhiked, and a man picked her up. At a gas station on an Indian Reservation, people warned her to get out of his car. They took her back to the highway, where several highway patrol officers were present. One of them drove her home, ensuring she arrived safely.

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERS









One of our partners is the family of Rizwana and Usman in Pakistan.

They feed the poor, have opened a school for the brickyard children, who otherwise would not get an education. They go to remote villages to care for the needy. They also share the Gospel of Jesus throughout their country.

In Pakistan, many families working in brick kilns face severe exploitation and hardship. These "brickyard families" are often trapped in a cycle of debt bondage, where they are forced to work long hours under harsh conditions for minimal pay.

The family of Brother Frayad had their debt paid off recently due to the hard work of this amazing Ministry! That means they are no longer in slavery to their debtor. Praise God for this amazing outreach and what all they do.

Jennifer Austin bandaged up Robert, who had been in a coma and due to something that happened he had to have half of his foot amputated. He still had

the staples and stitches in his foot..

She removed the staples and then went back a couple days later and removed the stitches.

SOBRIETY



Tommy called when some one gave him my business card. He just came back here from California and needed a pair of size 16 shoes. We happened to have a pair and I brought

them to him along with some long t-shirts. Tommy is about 6"8"". We chatted for awhile and I found out he had a daughter here and he really wanted to get off the streets. I asked him if he needed detox and he said no. I got him into the Wellness Care program and he was there 5 days doing their intake. The home was quite chaotic and it was not a good fit for Tommy, so he left... I reached out to Victory Outreach and spoke to Tom for quite awhile. He explained that it is a year long program that is completely free!! I have heard nothing but good about this organization and I had Tommy call. He spoke with Tom and they accepted him. We brought him some more items that had been purchased for him and he is with them now. The hardest part is he has to quit smoking!!! Please pray Tommy takes full advantage of this program.
