HOMELESS OUTREACH

STREET FEEDINGS



We fed 1800+ unhoused or less fortunate people during the second quarter. We prayed with over 200 people. We provided 100+ Bibles and Devotions. In addition, we provided

socks, shoes, clothing, hygiene and began passing out ice cold rags for them due to the heat...

POP-UPS



We finished out the second quarter with a bang!



We partnered with the Nevada Homeless Alliance (NHA) in April at the Bonneville Bus Terminal where we fed over 350 people, and prayed with about 50 people.



In May we partnered with the NHA again at the Lutheran Social Services where we fed 150 people and prayed with over half of them.

WOUND CARE

There is always a need for wound care and we are blessed to have Jennifer Austin on our team. Jennifer works tirelessly to make sure our friends are bandaged up so the healing can begin. FAMILY ASSISTANCE



We met Nicole on the streets. She was with her 1 year old son and she told us she was in a weekly with two jobs but was not getting many hours. I added her to our Job Board. I found out after

spending some time with her that she had been in a bad car accident a couple of years ago and was unable to walk for quite a long time. While in the hospital she found out she was pregnant with her beautiful son Zayden.

Zayden's father is a deadbeat and she decided she would be better off without him and decided to raise Zayden by herself.

She was recently hired by her old Employer and is on the right path.

We have been able to help Nicole with her rent and also diapers for Zayden. She is looking for a second job close to where she lives as she gets around by bus. We will continue to walk alongside her on her journey..

FAMILY ASSISTANCE



We received a call from Jaelyn that her special needs son, husband and dog needed assistance in staying in their motel for the weekend. They had an unforeseen issue occur that strapped them of money and she needed help to

get by for a few days. We were able to put them up and keep a roof over their head and are now assisting them to get into a weekly or possible their own place.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE



Alexx, Haley and their family reached out. They both have full time jobs, but hit a really big rough patch. They moved to Las Vegas in March 2023 to try to better our family and hit so many

roadblocks since we moved. They were able to secure housing but had nothing to fill it with. We were able to provide them with lots and lots of furniture.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE



We met Vanessa several months ago when we had some frozen meals to share. She and her husband came by and we were able to assist them in their time of need. Over the course of the

next few months, Vanessa had reached out to me. I learned Vanessa was in a Domestic Violence situation and she was ready to make a break from her husband. She had already lined up some things for her journey.

We were able to assist Vanessa with gas money to get to where she was going and lodging for a couple of nights for the journey. She now has 2 jobs and her own apartment and is so excited for her new life. She is close to her kids and they are so glad that she is back. She is a hustler and she is going to be just fine!!! Great job Vanessa. God is so good!!!

REHAB



This is Elizabeth. Once Jennifer bandaged her leg up she said she would go into the hospital for Therapy on her legs. They were one of the most horrendous looking wounds I think I have seen on the streets.



DETOX



Jordan was on the streets when we noticed her legs were very bad. Jennifer bandaged them up. A few days later Jennifer went back on on the streets with

her Street Team and ran into Jordan again. After checking her legs, and talking to Jordan about her situation, Jordan said she wanted to go into Detox. Two days later, Jennifer drove her down to Desert Parkway, but they wouldn't take him. She then took him to Seven Hills and got him checked in.

After detoxing for 6 days Seven Hills let her go without notifying Jennifer and unfortunately Jordan want back out on the streets. We have not seen her since, but will be looking next time we hit her area.

DETOX



This is Kashanda. She is pregnant and on Fentanyl. Jennifer spent 8 hours with her, to get her into the hospital to check herself and the baby out. Thru one of our

partners, we had lined up a shelter for her to get into... It wasn't 30 minutes from the time Jennifer left her in the hospital, that Kashanda checked herself out to go back on the streets. You win some and you lose some...Please pray for that unborn child!!

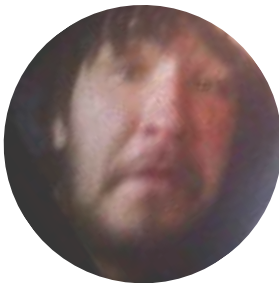
REHAB



This is JoAnn. We found her in a bad way. She was sitting in the sun with her legs full of sores. She is diabetic and she was in tears. We made some phone calls and one of our partners said they could get her help on Monday,

so we put her in a motel for the weekend, and on Monday she was taken to a safe house where they did an intake. She was not strong enough to get into a Shared room facility and her legs were in a bad way so we got her to the hospital. After a couple of days in the hospital with no rehab, she was admitted into a Rehab for her medication, She thought she was going to be in a wheelchair for the rest of her life, but Jennifer and I started her walking up and down the hall and before no time she was walking with her walker and now is fully mobile and waiting to get into a home.

OBIT



We recently met Nicholas and he was battling addiction. He wanted help but was not willing to let go of his dog to do so.

He also mentioned that he lost his fiancée last year &

had been super depressed since then. It wasn't a month later that Nicholas passed away. Nicholas died on the eve of his Fiancée's anniversary of her passing. We had such hopes for Nicholas. He left behind his mother, Kathy that also lives at the encampment. Rest in peace Nicholas.
