Ashley reached out, and we were able to secure her room that she was renting from PadSplit while she looked for another job. She applied faithfully and showed me every day where she applied.

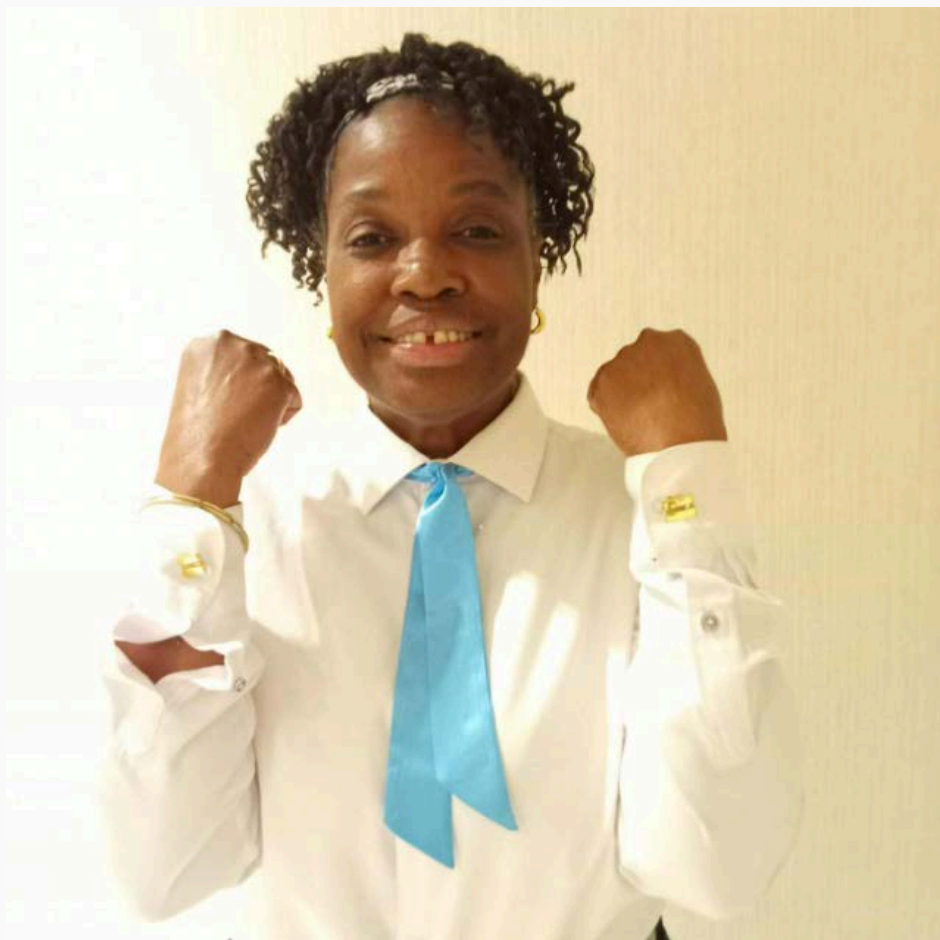

- Bryant - Paid for his Drivers License, Private Investigative Guard Card, Fingerprinting, and we were able to provide him with a safe place to stay for one week through our weekly housing program.”
- Nicole - Short on rent, and we stepped in to help. There are times when those we have helped in the past will need a little help, and if they are doing what they need to do, we will provide what we can.
- Vanessa needed personal items, and we were able to help.
- Gloria needed her RX and we were able to make that happen.

### Job Secured! Yolanda Shines - From Helped to Hired

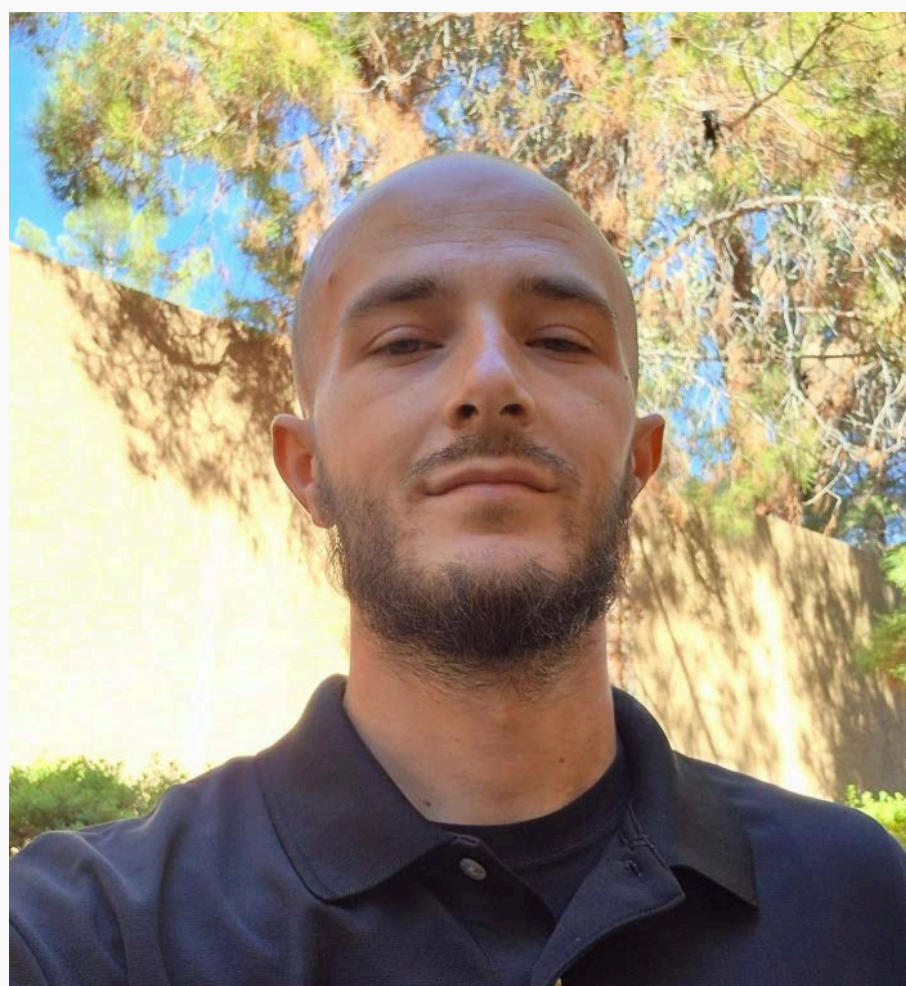


Yolanda and her brother had been taking care of their mom, and when she passed, they moved into a Padsplit. Her brother lost his job, which put them behind, and they got evicted. Yolanda continued to work.

We tried to get them into ER shelter with HopeLink, but because they do not have medical conditions, they were not eligible. They went to the Courtyard and stayed there. I told her that she should apply for a Security job, and we paid for her P.I.L.B. card as she had a job lined up. Today she is working, and so is her brother. Next, we will try to help them find housing.

### From Left Behind to Lifted Up - Michael's Journey



Michael came to Las Vegas with his girlfriend, hoping to have a nice vacation. But soon after arriving, an argument changed everything. His girlfriend left, and he suddenly found himself stranded — alone, hurting, and without support.

He had been clean for over 2 years and found himself relapsing.

Refusing to stay down, Michael decided to pull himself up by his bootstraps and reach out for help. That decision led him to Vegas Stronger, where he began his journey toward recovery. They helped him find a sober living home, but unfortunately, the environment

there was far from supportive — drugs were being used openly, and nothing was being done about it.

Feed My Sheep Homeless Outreach had also been working with Michael and guiding him on what he needed to do in order to get himself out of this situation. We were able to assist Michael in obtaining his TAM card and ID card, essential documents he needed to get back on his feet. We provided food to him when he was not able to get to food pantries. We added Michael to our Job Board. Michael stayed in constant contact with us, and we walked beside him every step of the way.

Through determination and faith, Michael found two jobs — one in a restaurant and another doing flagging. With hard work and support, he was soon ready to move into his own apartment. When that day came, our amazing volunteers came together to furnish his entire home, using the wish list Michael had provided.

In just four short months, Michael went from being left behind and broken to standing strong on his own two feet.

Michael's story is living proof that with faith, determination, and community, lives can be transformed — one person, one act of love, one step at a time.

#### In Loving Memory of Becky

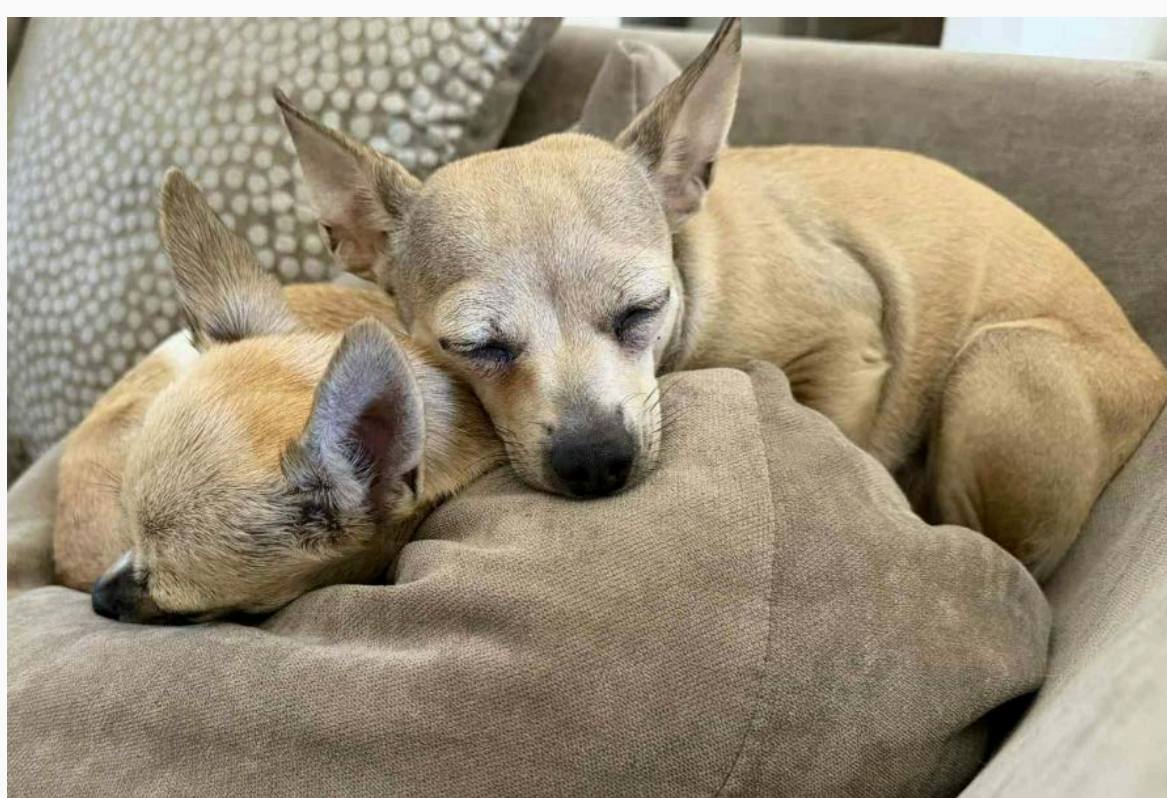
